## DIRECTIONS TO THE GUELPH BIBLE CONFERENCE CENTRE

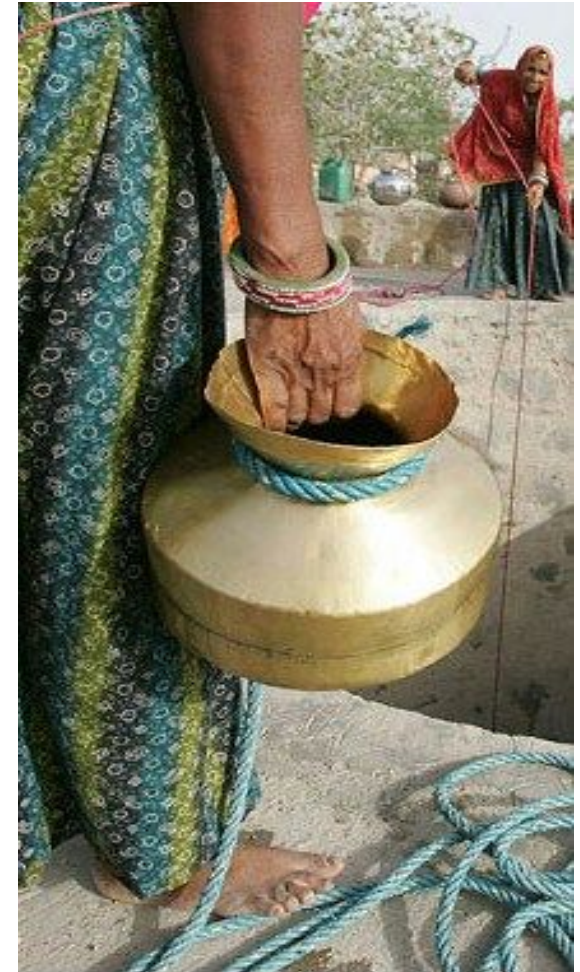
**From South**
